New York Yanks Must Regain 'Clutch Touch' Or They May be Out of First Place Tonight

(By United Press) Unless the Yankees regain that old "clutch touch" Thursday, they could be out of first place by nightfall for the first time since June 14.

And Manager Casey Stengel, resting his aces, Allie Reynolds and Vic Raschi for the big two-game show-down series with Cleveland beginning Friday, entrusted the fortunes of the world cham-

pions to rookies Tom Gorman in their finale with the White Sox. That business of gambling with second line hurlers was costly to the Yankees in recent outings as National League castoffs Johnny

Schmitz and Johnny Sain were kicked around by the White Sox so lustily they soon could be American League castoffs, too. Sain, effective through most of the season, faded fast in recent outings and lost his third straight game yesterday, 12 to 3, following similar mistreatment of Schmitz in the opener against the pesky White Sox. Cleveland, which goes hot a n d cold like faulty bathroom plumb-

ing, scalded the Red Sox yesterday with an 18-hit, 18 to 8 victory that featured a 10-run fourth inning rally. That victory, in which the Indians scored their most runs for any game this year, put them within a game of the top, or closer to the Yankees than they have been at any time since June 15. On that fateful day, the Yankees twice defeated the Indians and went in front to stay. Cleveland could take over first by one per-

centage point today if it wins and New York loses. The Indians, who also are holding back a pair of aces for the Yankees, named spot hurler Steve Gromek to go in the finale against Boston. That leaves Mike Garcia and Bobby Feller ready for the Yankee series. Chicago put over a six-run rally in the fourth to kayo Sain. The White Sox made 14 hits off five Yankee pitchers, Sam Mele getting

a homer. Gene Woodling homered for the Yankees as Saul Rogovin pitched five-hit ball for his 11th victory and his second against New York. Luke Easter, making two hits in the big inning at Boston, climaxed it with a grand slam homer. Larry Doby and Ray Boone also homered for the Indians, who got all their runs in clusters, four in the fifth and four in the seventh. Bob Lemon breezed to his 15th victory, although he gave up 15 hits himself. In the National League, the Dodgers again moved seven full games in front of the Giants by topping the Reds, 6 to 3, on eight-

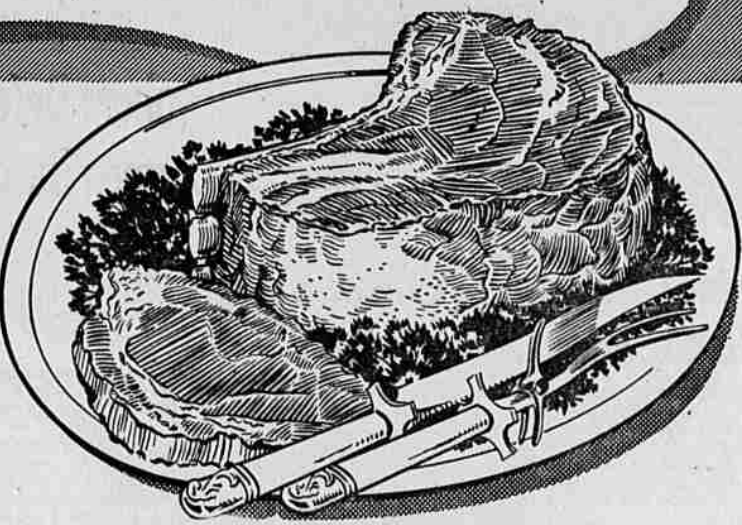
hit pitching by Billy Loes. Roy Campanella hit his 17th homer and Gil Hodges his 27th. Ken Raffensberger, the loser, and Cal Abrams homered for Cincy. The Giants were rained out at Chicago and the Phils kept pace by defeating the Pirates, 3 to 1. At St. Louis, in a game limited to 7½ innings by rain, the Cards whipped the Braves, 9 to 2. In the only other American League game, the Athletics topped the Tigers, 4 to 3. **WEDNESDAY'S STAR**—Cornie Ryan of the Phils who hit a home run, walked three times and stole two bases in a 3 to 1 victory over Pittsburgh.
