SEATTLE, Aug. 21 (AP)—Former Champion Charley Coe, Canadian Champion Walter McElroy and Gene Littler, a non-title winner who has been on the verge of great things in the golfing world for several years, were favored Thursday as the 1952 U. S. National Amateur golf tournament rolled down to the final stages.

There were 16 men left in the competition as play got under way Thursday morning, but when night falls only four will be in the running for the world's most coveted simon-pure crown.

Coe, who won the title in 1949, is playing his best golf from tee to green in years. Wednesday he was two over par for 32 holes in disposing of W. B. Hyde, Olympia, Wash., 4 and 3, and John Levinson, Niles, Ill., 2 and 1.

"I'm playing better now than I have at any time since winning the crown in 1949," he said after the two matches. The shy, 140-pound, 6-foot, 1-inch star, who slugs the ball out with the best of the professionals, looked like a champion in all departments.

Such well-knowns as Frank Stranahan and Harvie Ward, the latter the British Amateur champ, sat on the sidelines after taking thumpings in the fifth round Wednesday.

Coe meets Jimmy McHale of Philadelphia, the former Walker Cupper, in the round of 16 Thursday.

Marion (Sonny) Hiskey, the Twin Falls, Idaho, star, followed by a group of fans from his home town, won two matches the hard way. He whipped Jim Blair of Oakland Park, Kan., and Dr. George Trainor, each on the 19th hole. He meets McElroy in the next set-to. The Canadian king has advanced with a 1-up triumph over Dale Morey, Martinsville, Ind., and 2 and 1 over Dan Silvestri, San Francisco city.
