

### Home Lighting Trend Back To Use of Lamps on Floors

WASHINGTON, Aug. 21 (AP)—My wife, like a lot of women, takes a fiendish delight in moving the furniture every few days.

One early morning, I sneaked in, shed my shoes, unhooked and made a neat little dive into my half of the twin bed set. I landed on the floor, woke up everybody, and caught you know what, Veronica had moved the bed.

I thought I had the situation settled when we moved into a place where most of the lighting is built into the walls. In short, it didn't make any sense to move my easy chair away from the light. Likewise, the beds with reading lamps built in.

But now what happens? The lamp people say that the trend in lighting for 1952 and 1953 and so on is back toward floor lamps that can be picked up and plugged in anywhere in the house, just like old times.

The National Home Lamp Council explains the change by insisting the modern home must have floor lamps "to lighten up those dark corners."

Some wag made up a story about one fellow who took a look at a dark corner in his house and found "one Jack, two cigarettes, a tennis ball, a Christmas ornament, and the key to the back door." That fellow's wife must have been one untidy housekeeper.

On the more serious side, I have a statement from Richard Bennett, formerly head of the Department of Architecture at Yale University. There is a man who knows his lamps.

Said he: "The floor lamp is attuned to the female mind. Woman never can make up her mind. She'll change the arrangement of furniture in the rooms in her home dozens of times as fancies strike her. She can move her floor lamps."

Bennett also pointed out another fact. "The human eye," he said, "requires light in order to see. The light must be directed properly

on the material that is being read. Because people grow up to different heights, have different ideas as to how far from the tip of the nose a book should be held and hold varying theories on which part of a chair a person should sit, the problem of light direction, or diffusion as the experts call it, is important.

"That is why the new floor lamps are light-weight and easily movable. It also is why so many of them have shafts that permit immediate elevation or depression of the shaft and also have swivel-type reflectors."
