

Doctor Claims No Cure Found For Baldness

CHICAGO (AP) — Dr. Otto Rattner, noted dermatologist at Northwestern University, attributes baldness to heredity and said to "count the bald barbers" if you are tempted by hair tonic ads.

He said no effective cure has been found to remedy or delay baldness in men.

Baldness is passed from father to daughter, who acts as a carrier and transmits it to her son, Rattner said. Therefore if the mother's father was bald, it is possible her son will develop a shiny pate. Likewise, if you are bald your daughter's son may be bald, and there is little that can be done to prevent it.

The subject of falling hair long has been clothed in mystery and superstition, Rattner said. He related the biblical story of Sampson, whose muscles melted with each snip as Delilah sheared away his locks.

Conversely, baldness long has been associated with superior mentality, Rattner said. It's all a lot of hocus pocus, according to the doctor.

He cited "remedies" which have been tried through the ages. An Egyptian salve consisted of equal parts of the fats of a lion, hippopotamus, crocodile and serpent, he said. "Ashes of little frogs, applied suddenly, cureth the fall of hair," was taken from an old text.

Bald spots in later days were rubbed with the middle bark of an elm tree, with watercress or even onion followed by application of honey and boxwood.

Treatments today include the mange cure, creosote or cholesterol, with perfume, quinine, tar and other ingredients added, Rattner said.

But none of the cures have produced "satisfactory results," he concluded.

Chicago Lawyers To Watch Polls

CHICAGO (AP)—Mobile squads of lawyers will act as trouble-shooters to prevent fraud and error at the Chicago polls Nov. 4.

County Judge Edmund K. Jarecki, head of the Chicago election machinery, says he will use a fleet of 100 taxicabs equipped with two-way radios and each carrying an attorney.

Jarecki will start a training school for the lawyers. He said the new system will be faster and more effective than volunteer watchers.

"It will be a big advantage to get them to the scene quickly," the judge explained. "They will be able to do much more than our employes can do by telephone contact with poll officials."

The lawyers will be paid by the election board, but Jarecki said he does not know what their salaries will be.

CONNEAUT, O. (AP)—If a radio ham here announces he has just had contact with Bombay or Cape-town, he is likely to get an answer of "so what?"

This little town believes it has more amateur "ham" short-wave stations in proportion to its size than any other place on earth. There are 17 stations in a population of 10,000—about one for every 590 persons. They're all in it for fun, but they have done good work in emergencies.

Wilbur C. Gross and Kenneth E. Fields first opened their tiny stations in 1921 and have been going ever since. They formed the Conneaut Radio Club that is still strong and active.

"We use code, English and international code," Gross says. "I can talk to China as easily as my wife can talk over the back fence."

Missing Chapter Changes His Text

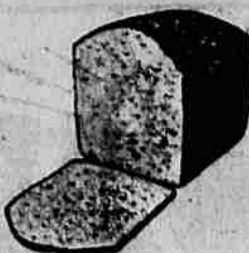

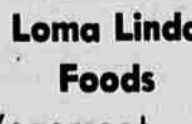
