Dulles Asks FBI To Study Record

NEW YORK, Nov. 21 (AP)—John Foster Dulles, picked as secretary of state in the Eisenhower cabinet, announced Friday that "there is going to be no taint of suspicion about the new State Department."

"The first thing I did this morning was to speak on the phone to Mr. J. Edgar Hoover, head of the FBI," Dulles said. "I asked him to put his best men to work to investigate my life record and to report to Gen. Eisenhower."

"There is going to be no taint of suspicion about the new state department. That goes for the top, for the bottom, and for all between. That's all."

Dulles is on record with expression of a firm belief that President-elect Eisenhower can end the war in Korea, and he now in the number one position to make that belief come true.

How he expects a peace will be accomplished, the newly designated secretary of state-to-be has not specified, but it certainly will be no surrender to Communism.

Dulles has warmly supported United States and United Nations action to crush the Korean attack, which he saw at its outset as a Communist move aimed at eventual domination of Japan.

The 64-year-old attorney and active Protestant churchman will have unique advantages both as a shaper and an executor of foreign policy when he assumes in January the job for which he has been "in training" for most of his adult life.

Convicts Nabbed With Stolen Car

Two convicts who escaped from the state penitentiary at Salem last Sunday were apprehended in Fresno county, Calif., yesterday in possession of the car stolen here Monday evening from William C. Fickas.

The convicts, who were prison trustees, are Edward J. Wardell and Richard V. Abney. They were reportedly working outside of the prison enclosure when they walked away. They apparently hitch-hiked to Bend that night and stole the Fickas car the next day.

Reds Have Corps Of Propagandists

WASHINGTON, Nov. 21 (AP)—Russian propagandists have an easy job compared with their free world counterparts.

The staff of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee reported Friday the Kremlin is using 1,400,000 skilled propagandists in a "gigantic" move to divide the West and make "the world safe for Stalinism."

Funeral services for Christian Tinner, who died Thursday morning, will be held Saturday at 2 p. m. at the Niswonger-Winslow chapel. The Rev. Stanley G. Gunsten of First Lutheran Church will officiate.

Mr. Tinner's death was from injuries suffered when he was struck by a car Wednesday evening on Revere avenue, near his home. The death was the first traffic fatality in the city of Bend in over two years.

Red Expected To Confess 'Crimes'

VIENNA, Austria, Nov. 21 (AP)—Communism's biggest trial since the Soviet mass-purge of the mid-1930's went into its second day Friday with Bedrich Gember, once the Kremlin's chief agent in Red Czechoslovakia, expected to confess his "crimes."

Gember was listed as the number two defendant of the 14 former top Czech Reds on trial in Pankrac Prison courtroom on charges ranging from treason and espionage to murder and Titosim.

Rudolf Slansky, who as secretary-general of the Czech Communist party was over Gember in the satellite state, was the top defendant in the trial which opened Thursday.

Rated in the number three spot of the defendants was former Foreign Minister Vladimir Clementis, who was probably better known to the outside world, but not as powerful as Slansky and Gember once were within Red Czechoslovakia.

All 14 defendants except Clementis are Jews. Gember, a handsome man with heavy black hair, once was a delegate to the Cominform, in Czechoslovakia he worked as Slansky's deputy.

IN STOCKHOLM
STOCKHOLM, Sweden, Nov. 21 (AP)—The first civilian airliner to cross the Atlantic over the "roof of the world," from Los Angeles to Copenhagen, Denmark, arrived in Stockholm Friday for a check of its engines. The Scandinavian Airlines system Arlid Viking blazed

a new passenger route within 160 miles of the North Pole on its history-making flight Thursday. It arrived here 28 hours and seven minutes after taking off from Los Angeles.
