### Sermon Series Set by Pastor

Rev. Jack M. MacLeod, pastor of First Presbyterian church of Bend, will begin a series of five sermons next Sunday morning, May 23, entitled "Our Freedoms Under God." The sermons are based on a letter to Presbyterians which was released last fall by the General Council of the Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A., giving a statement of some of the moral issues which must be faced in this country and in the world today.

Sermon titles for the series include: "The General Council Speaks," "Present dangers," "The Church's Prophetic Role," "The Majesty of Truth" and "God's Sovereign Rule."

"Back of the letter is a recognition of the historic witness of the Presbyterian Church in public affairs," Rev. MacLeod said. "The letter is based largely on social pronouncements of the 1952 and 1953 General Assemblies of the Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A."

The minister added that more than 800 communications have been received by officials of the denomination concerning the letter, which was printed in a church publication.

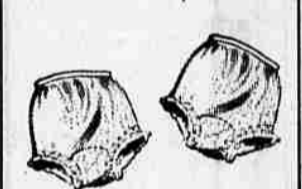
