## Square Dancers Schedule Party

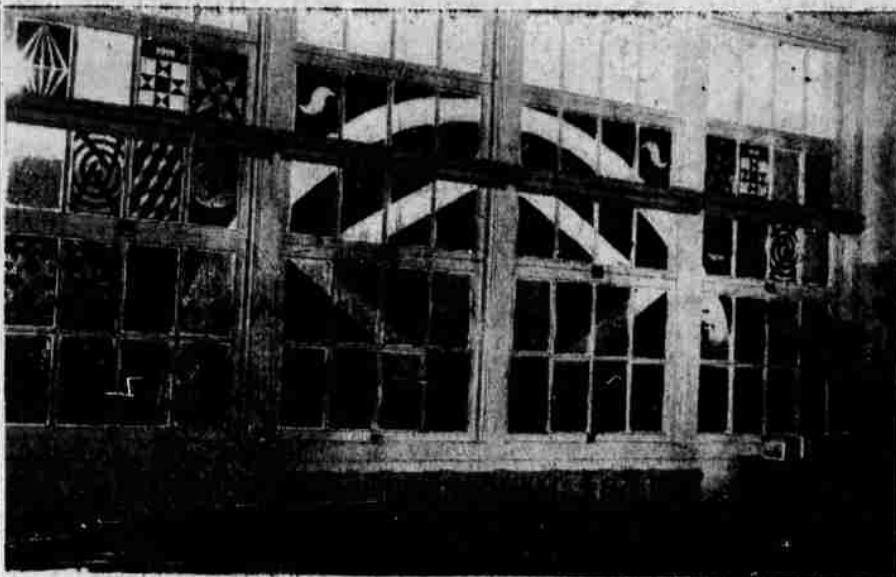

## Savings Group At 20 Year Mark

The Deschutes Federal Savings and Loans association, headed this year by George P. Gove, is observing the 20th anniversary of its founding in Bend through distribution of a 3 per cent semi-annual dividend, payable as of Dec. 31, 1954.

This dividend, Walter G. Peak, secretary of the association since its organization in the fall of 1934, reports, will mean the distribution of some \$41,000 in the local community.

The association's first financial statement revealed assets of \$13,223.40. As of Nov. 30 this year, assets had increased to \$3,023,236.51.
