

Filberts Are "A Natural" To Add Zest to Desserts

After a hearty dinner, what to serve for dessert?

The clever homemaker will solve this dilemma with a light, fluffy, refreshing dessert such as this filbert mold, made with a gelatin base.

Filbert-Mince-meat Mold

1 cup filberts
1 envelope unflavored gelatin
4 cup cold water

1/2 cup dark corn syrup
1/4 tsp. cinnamon
1/4 tsp. salt
1/4 cup water
3 eggs, separated
3 tbsps. sugar
1 cup mince-meat
Coarsely chop and toast filberts. Soften gelatin in cold water. Stir together the syrup, cinnamon, salt and water. Beat egg yolks and add to the syrup mixture. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until slightly thickened. Add softened gelatin, stirring until dissolved. Chill until syrupy.

Beat egg whites until stiff; add sugar. Fold mince-meat and nuts into the gelatin and then the egg whites. Spoon into a mold and chill until firm. Serve with whipped cream. For a festive touch, garnish with marzipan fruits and huckleberry leaves. Serves 8 to 10.

Eggs Head List Of Plentiful Food For January

From the United States Department of Agriculture comes news of bountiful food supplies for January, 1955.

Eggs head the list. Record high production was reached in all parts of the country. Five per cent above 1953 and 9 per cent above average.

Early and midseason oranges are expected to total 73 million boxes, which is 11 per cent over the previous year, and about 40 per cent above average. While the grapefruit crop is figured to be below 1953 totals, more than ample supplies are expected on the market. Seasonally popular tangerines will be in greater supply than a year ago.

Continued high beef production points to ample supplies for January. With the peak month of pork slaughter coming favorably with a year earlier, supplies are expected to be plentiful.

The all-time record high crop of turkeys, totaling 61 million birds, will provide adequate supplies for January—especially in the heavier weights.

The nation's rice crop is estimated at 58.5 million 100-pound bags, 58 per cent more than average.

Dairy products, butter, cheese, fluid milk and dry milk solids, will continue in good supply.

Raisins, almonds, walnuts and filberts will be more than ample during January, along with vegetable shortenings and salad oils.

Car Insurance Reductions Due

PORTLAND (UP)—Oregon motorists may save an estimated \$155,000 on reductions in fire, theft and collision automobile insurance, approved Tuesday by Robert B. Taylor, state insurance commissioner.

The National Automobile Underwriters Association made the reductions on behalf of its member companies. About 175 member companies do business in Oregon, Taylor said.

The new rates are retroactive on all policies issued on or after Dec. 1. \$100 and \$50 deductible collision insurance will go down about six per cent in Portland and about 5 1/2 per cent in the rest of the state, the insurance commissioner said.

Rates on fire, theft and comprehensive insurance have been cut about 15 per cent. The coast-wise slash leaves out some 75 independent companies doing business in Oregon, but they are expected to adjust their rates to meet the competition.
