OAKR IDG FIREBALL'S COURSE CHARTED - Information provided by observers in all parts of the state made it possible for Dr. J. Hugh Pruett, Pacific northwest director of the American Meteor Society, to chart the course of the brilliant fireball that blazed through Oregon skies on the early evening of March 8. Dr. Pruett determined that the huge, noisy meteor bored into the atmosphere about 60 miles above the earth and exploded just east of Mt. Washington. Dotted lines leads to points where the fireball was first observed, and dashes indicate point of disappearance. Some excellent observations were obtained by Dr. Pruett from Bend and Prineville. 
