# Steelworkers State Walkout At Birmingham

ATLANTA, Ga. (UP) — Steelworkers at the huge Tennessee Coal and Iron Institute (TCI) Friday seven other strike groups on Friday in Birmingham, Ala. "The Pittsburgh of the South."

The walkout occurred while labor groups in Birmingham talked about a general strike. There was no known dispute between the steelworkers' union and the TCI.

Workers at the steel plant, one of five units of TCI, a division of U. S. Steel, failed to show up for work at midnight and some 250 employees immediately threw up picket lines.

It could not be determined immediately whether the steel walkout was the beginning of a general strike in Birmingham where union leaders had been discussing such a move for a week. But R. E. Farr, district director of the steelworkers' union, said he understood the 27,000 employees of all five TCI plants would be on strike by Saturday.

Union leaders and company officials were mum at first about the walk-out but one high official of the steelworkers' union said after a meeting at which the strike vote was taken that "the people want it."

It was known the steelworkers were sympathetic toward south-wide strikes against the Southern Bell Telephone Co. and the Louisville and Nashville Railroad and affiliated lines.

Other strikes in Birmingham involved the Ingal Iron Works, McWane Pipe Co., Murray Transport Co., metal fabricators and furnishers, and paperhangers.

Hayes Aircraft plant at Birmingham, which modifies the C-119 plane for the Air Force, is threatened with a strike in a contract dispute.

The 33-day strikes against the telephone and railroad companies have been marked with violence and vandalism and much of it occurring in Birmingham. Thursday night, a small mob of union sympathizers stoned police officers in front of a telephone exchange three following a bomb blast that shattered windows out of a home.

Thermon Phillips, National CIO representative, said that labor in the Birmingham area is "up in arms over the treatment our people have received at the hands of police in the Southern Bell strike."

All available police and firemen with hoses were called in to control the crowd which assembled in front of the sub-exchange and began stoning officers.

## Weekly Balance Sheet Compares Good, Bad News

The Good. 1. President Eisenhower instructed the State Department to send to all 75 nations with which the United States has diplomatic relations information that will enable them to produce the life-giving Salk anti-polio vaccine.

The Bad. 2. President Eisenhower approved an agreement by which the United States will share with its 13 partners in the North Atlantic Treaty Organization information on the use of atomic weapons.

3. Army Secretary Robert T. Stevens, returning from a tour of the Far East, said he did not believe the Chinese Communists planned any immediate attack in the Formosa area.

4. In Europe, Gen. Anthony C. McAuliffe, commander of United States forces, said his 7th Army was now so strong that it would defend all its territory in Western Germany against any Russian attack instead of starting with a strategic retreat to the Rhine River.

5. Troops of rebellious sects in Southern Viet Nam in Indochina bombarded a city held by forces of Premier Ngo Dinh Diem and started a blockade of his capital, Saigon. The danger of civil war was so serious that Gen. J. Lawton Collins, special American envoy, postponed his planned departure for the United States.

6. The West German government fearing an imminent communist blockade of West Berlin, called on the United States, Britain and France to demand that Russia guarantee free access to the city. In their latest move the Reds alleged that West Berlin was a spy center and intimated that they might isolate it.

7. Afghanistan, the rugged mountain kingdom which lies between Pakistan and the Soviet Union, threatened to become a trouble spot. Afghanistan angrily protested a Pakistan plan to incorporate a northwest frontier province area into a new administrative district.

It was reported that Russia, capitalizing on the dispute, offered Afghanistan armed aid against Pakistan—America's ally.

## Settlement Seen In Union Case

HONOLULU (UP) — Jack Hall, Hawaii regional director of the International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's Union, has hinted that an out-of-court settlement with the Juneau Spruce Company may be reached soon.

Juneau Spruce won a \$750,000 law suit against the union in an Alaska federal court six years ago. Since then, it has been trying to collect the judgment, which now amounts to more than one million dollars.

Hall refused yesterday to comment directly on questions but he said it no longer appears necessary for Hawaii Local 142 to disaffiliate from the ILWU.

The local's executive board had recommended breaking ties with the international to make sure that none of the dues collected in Hawaii went to the ILWU and thence to Juneau Spruce.

Hall predicted that the executive board will probably meet in the near future to change the recommendation.
