Calves 50; market fairly active, mostly steady; good-choice vealers 22.25; few good heifers today 20; commercial grades 13.50-19.

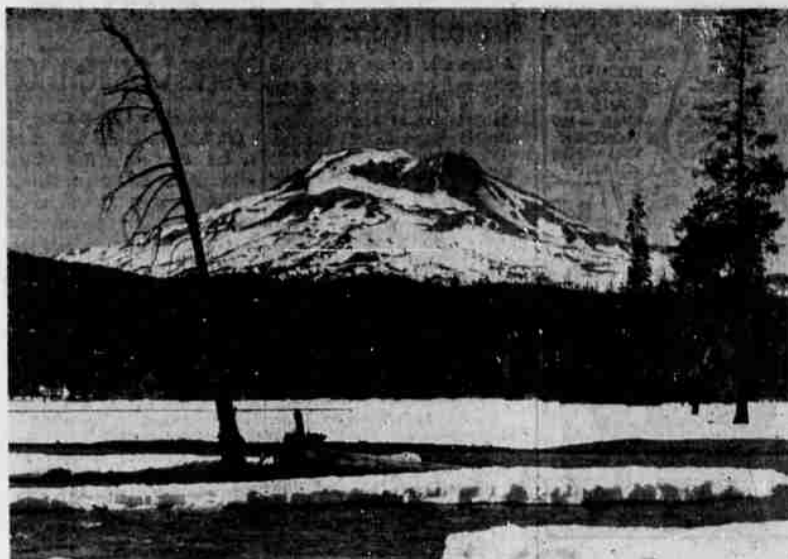
Matylinski Rites Due Thursday
