

Ducks Edge Northwestern; Beavers Trounce Michigan

CORVALLIS (UP)—Oregon and Oregon State basketball teams try to make a clean sweep of their series with Michigan and Northwestern at Eugene tonight after both clubs scored victories last night at Gill Coliseum.

Oregon edged Northwestern 85-81 and Oregon State trounced Michigan 84-71 before 5058 happy fans. The two Oregon teams switch opponents tonight.

Max Anderson poured in 31 points to lead Oregon to its win. The Ducks were behind 52-44 at halftime but came back strong in the second period.

Jerry Ross scored 21 points and Phil McHugh 14 for Oregon. Dick Mast hit 27 for Northwestern. Oregon led in shooting percentage, 49-281, and in rebounds, 60 to 40.

Oregon State and Michigan battled evenly throughout the first half with the score tied 14 times. OSC led 39-36 at half.

It was the sparkling play of a pair of sophomores that pulled the Beavers ahead. Ken Nanson and Dave Gambee scored 22 and 19 points respectively.

Ron Kramer, Michigan's great football end, scored 17 points and Tom Jorgensen chipped in with 18 for the Wolverines.

Bend College Five Dropped By Invaders

An invading band of Yakima Valley junior college Indians went on the scoring warpath the second half as they came from behind to scalp Central Oregon College 74 to 57 at Kenwood Tuesday.

The classy Washington team, passing and shooting with plenty of poise and finesse, trailed most of the first half and was behind 34-29 at intermission after a nip-and-tuck half.

Yakima tallied six straight points to open the second half and take a 35-34 lead. The advantage changed hands on nearly every basket until COC went ahead 44-41. Then the Nitehawks hit a scoring drought and the Indians poured in 12 consecutive points to go in front 53-41.

The two teams began trading baskets again and Central Oregon was only trailing 63-56 when another dry spell set in. Yakima rang up 11 more points while all the Hawks got was a freethrow out of Jim Crowell with just :28 remaining.

Ron Karlson, 6-5 center, was the big difference. The lanky center, nursing a bad leg, was held out most of the first half but he scored 17 points the second half and killed the Nitehawks with his tip-ins and board work. He was high for the winners with 19 while guard Bill Maples contributed 15 and John Rhine 12.

Tom Ray was high for the game with 20. Guards Crowell and Al Christensen had 13 and 10 respectively for COC.

The two teams meet again tonight at 8 p.m. at Kenwood.
