

Floor Action on Hells Canyon Dam Issue Expected in About 2 Weeks

WASHINGTON (UP) — The Senate Democratic leadership may schedule floor action in about two weeks on a bill to authorize the controversial Hells Canyon Dam it was indicated today.

The bill voted out of the Senate Interior Committee by Democrats Tuesday, will be brought up "well before the end of the session," a Democratic source said.

Officially the scheduling will be done by the Democratic Policy Committee. The group will consider the bill at a meeting to be called later, committee officials said.

There was a report also that the Senate would act first on a bill to authorize the \$156 million Frying Pan-Arkansas Project in Colorado. It had administration support, and the two bills have been linked in jockeying for Republican committee votes for the Hells Canyon Project.

House Action Delayed
In the House, Hells Canyon supporters said they have the votes

to get an authorization bill out of the House Interior Committee. If they ever get a committee quorum together.

A point of no quorum raised by Rep. Hamer Budge (R-Ida.) prevented a vote on the bill Tuesday. He was one of two Republicans who attended the meeting, and Democrats charged the Republicans with boycotting it deliberately.

Budge indicated he would raise the point again at the next meeting, set for Tuesday, under similar circumstances. He said there was "no sense" in having a committee vote on "a billion dollar bill" with less than half of the members present.

He said he sensed "a kind of reluctance" by some Democrats to vote on the bill.

Votes Are Promised
Rep. Grace Pfoz (D-Ida.) said votes for approval of the bill are promised, either by attendance or proxy. But she said next Tuesday is too far ahead to predict whether enough Democrats will attend to make a quorum.

She said she is "quite optimistic" that the House Rules Committee and the House itself will approve the bill when and if it gets out of committee.

Budge agreed it is possible the House will pass the bill, saying it "kind of depends on how interested" Speaker Sam Rayburn becomes in it. But he said he feels sure that President Eisenhower will veto the measure if it comes before him.

The President announced opposition to the project in a speech at Boise before his election, he said, and has continued to express opposition.

Mrs. Pfoz said she "can't believe the President would take a biased view" on the project in view of his support for Frying Pan-Arkansas and Upper Colorado projects.
