

GOP Divided On Statement From President

WASHINGTON (UP)—Republicans today were split over whether President Eisenhower should give a quick public reaffirmation of his earlier announcement that he will run for a second term.

GOP leaders believe almost unanimously that Mr. Eisenhower will seek re-election despite his illness. But they are divided on how soon he should restate his intention.

Some Republicans, including members of Congress, were said to be in "no hurry" for the President to make an early statement. They see no reason for him to issue a statement while he is in the hospital — where he will be at least another week, and probably longer.

Other Republicans, however, were reported uneasily over mounting talk questioning the availability of the President for the GOP nomination.

Warship Has TV Receivers

PHILADELPHIA (UP)—The USS Boston, recently recommissioned at the Philadelphia Naval Base as this country's first guided missile warship, has four launching racks for "Terrier" anti-aircraft missiles to provide fleet air defense. Also TV receivers for the crew's enjoyment.

The Boston's crew will be able to watch TV shows by means of an amplified master television antenna system whenever the cruiser is in port. TV receivers in the cruiser's recreation areas will be connected to a single TV antenna array mounted on a portable-type mast. The antenna will be taken down while the Boston is out to sea.

According to the Jerrold Electronics Corporation, which engineered the system for the vessel, The Boston's crew will be able to watch local television in foreign ports if the systems are compatible with ours.

Bank Debits Show Increase

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene.—Bank debits in the Central Oregon area, including Bend, showed an increase of 4.4 per cent in May over May of 1955 and at the same time, a drop of 2.8 per cent over April.

The debits are collected monthly from 152 Oregon banks by the bureau of business research at the University of Oregon. Bank debits represent the dollar value of checks drawn against the deposit accounts of individuals and business firms. Debits are regarded as good indicators of current business activity.

Totals for the state for May were \$1,581,724,449, an increase of 13.5 per cent over May, 1955, and a 5.3 per cent increase over April, 1956.
