Probe in Plane Crash Underway

Coast Guard tug steamed in from the Atlantic Ocean today with its grim cargo — the body fragments of some of the 74 victims of Wednesday's crash of a Venezuelan airliner.

The tug Tamarac's grisly haul included about 100 pounds of body fragments and 100 pounds of debris.

The remains were transferred by a barge to New York's Bellevue Hospital where identification was declared to be virtually impossible.

Cause of the crash, the worst in the history of regularly scheduled airline service, was undetermined.

Venezuelan aviation authorities said they will investigate the crash "to the last detail."

The Lines Aeronautas Venezolanas (LAV) Super Constellation, attempting to return to New York's Idlewild airport with a runaway engine, caught fire, burst into flames and plummeted 9,000 feet to the ocean.

None of the 64 passengers nor 10 crew members survived.
