

Warning of Heavy Snow, Blizzard Conditions Issued

Weathermen warned of heavy snow and blizzard conditions in portions of the plains states today in the path of a widespread storm system that doused California with a beneficial \$10 million rain.

The East, meanwhile, thawed out from one of the worst cold waves in years.

The western storm swirled out of the Pacific Sunday, and

dumped one to three inches of snow over eastern Washington, North Dakota and the Central Rockies.

Salt Lake City was blanketed with a 4-inch snowfall, and up to 20 inches buried some mountain areas.

Weathermen said the storm will whip into a blizzard as it moves out of the Rockies into the northern and central plains today.

Rain to the south brought relief to drought-stricken California rangelands. Agricultural officials figured the rain was worth \$10 million to cattle and sheep ranchers who have been buying hay at \$30 to \$35 a ton or selling lean animals.

A surge of cold air penetrated the far north from Montana to Minnesota, but weathermen said the air mass wasn't as frigid as the one that sent much of the nation into a deep freeze last week.

Mild winds that brought moderating temperatures to the Midwest during the weekend pushed into the Atlantic Coast states, boosting overnight temperatures 10 to 30 degrees higher than the night before.

Above freezing temperatures extended as far north as southern New England, with the greatest warming occurring in Pennsylvania and New York state. Albany, N.Y., reported an early morning ready of 35 as compared with one below at the same time Sunday.

Temperatures continued mild in most of the Midwest where readings were above freezing as far north as the Great Lakes.

Some early morning readings included Boston 38, Detroit 36, Nashville 45, Miami 71, New Orleans 61, Duluth 21, Denver 46, Los Angeles 49 and Seattle 25.

Ingrid Back In Europe After Visit

NEW YORK (UP)—Ingrid Bergman was here over the weekend. Sunday night she went back to Paris.

The visit lasted 34 hours. Miss Bergman came to accept the New York Film Critics Award for her role in Anastasia, but spent most of her time mending fences in film fandom.

She smiled just about the whole time, even when complaining that Americans expected her to smile too much.

Miss Bergman was smiling when the airliner that brought her here from Paris pulled to a halt at Idlewild International Airport at 8:25 a.m. EST Saturday. She was smiling when she stepped down the ramp 15 minutes later, bundled in mink and a white babushka.

Then she beamed her way through an airport mob scene, a session with newspaper photographers, a news conference, a series of television interviews and tape recorded interviews in French, Italian and German.

"Now we need one interview in Chinese," she said.

She laughed when she said that. During an hour of interviews at the airport, Miss Bergman answered almost every question. She left her exact age (39 to 42) a secret. She denied a rift with her husband. She refused to comment when told a former U.S. senator who once wanted her banned from the U.S. had decided to forgive her.

"It was pretty tough in those days," she said, smiling, "but time takes care of everything."

Had she been worried about the reception she would receive here? "I wasn't worried," she said. "I have never been worried about anything. If I was worried, I would be another character."

What about all the publicity she had received? "My life is yours," she told the press.

Did she have any regrets? "I have never regretted anything."

Had her celebrated romance with Roberto Rossellini hurt her career? "No, not at all."

With that, Miss Bergman was off for a round of activities planned for her by the two 20th-Century-Fox press agents assigned to her for her stay.

WHEREAS, the State Department of Agriculture of the State of Oregon has determined that an epidemic of Rabies exists in certain areas of Deschutes County, State of Oregon, and that such disease is a hazard to the health of livestock and human beings and that it is necessary and advisable to eradicate or prevent the spread of such disease.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to authority vested in the Department by ORS 596.402 and after considering all factors named in ORS 596.412, a quarantine hereby is imposed upon the following described areas of Deschutes County, Oregon, together with such regulations relating thereto as are deemed necessary for the eradication and control of the disease in said area and the prevention of the spread of the disease into other areas of the State:

QUARANTINED AREA
Township 16, Range 11 E., W.M., Township 16, Range 12 E., W.M., Township 16, Range 13 E., W.M., Township 17, Range 11 E., W.M., Township 17, Range 12 E., W.M., Township 17, Range 13 E., W.M., Township 18, Range 11 E., W.M., Township 18, Range 12 E., W.M., and Township 18, Range 13 E., W.M., all in Deschutes County, Oregon.

The following regulations hereby are made applicable to the above described quarantined area:

1. All dogs within the city limits of the City of Bend are to be vaccinated for Rabies and must be confined to the owner's premises or be kept on a leash while this quarantine is in force.

2. All dogs in the above quarantined area, but outside of the City of Bend, must be vaccinated for Rabies and until vaccinated must be confined to the owner's premises or be kept on a leash.

3. Dogs vaccinated for rabies (owner must have proof of vaccination) after July 1, 1956, are exempt from vaccination.

4. No unvaccinated dog or dog vaccinated prior to July 1, 1956, shall be removed from the above described quarantined area; provided, however, any vaccinated dog may be removed from the above described quarantined area upon the written authorization of the Department of Agriculture.
