Chief Truett said a bill passed by the 1957 legislature, which took effect Tuesday, August 20, will no longer permit anyone under 18 to teach another person how to drive a car.

Chief Truett said he has instructed his officers to begin checking for possible violations of the new law. Warnings will be given until he feels that the public has had time to become familiar with the law, he said. After that, citations will be made for any infractions.
