Sandbag operations paying off in flood-ravaged area

Around the clock sandbag operations against enraged rivers were paying off in Nebraska today but new floods elsewhere in the Middle West brought the number of homeless to 6,000 persons.

National Guardsmen, civil defense workers and volunteers were winning the battle of the levees in Nebraska, hardest-hit state in the Midwest flood belt.

Although close to 4,000 persons were homeless in the state, the floods failed to make a major breakthrough.

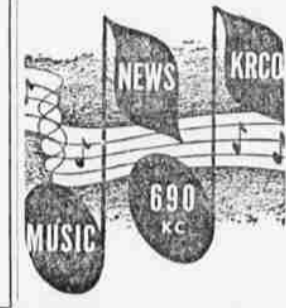
However, the tons of water surging down flooded streams in the country's mid-section were pouring into the great Mississippi

TELEVISION IN REVIEW 'The Bat' gets new TV series off to good start

NEW YORK (UPI) — For those who swing only with the quiet, underplayed mysteries, "The Bat" will never do.

But for those who enjoy their who-dun-its in the all-out, no-don't-hesitate style, where characters have names like Courtleigh Fleming, names reach through windows, shadowy figures dash down corridors, people streak up and down stairs while old women shriek and heroes hold their chins high, Thursday night's production of "The Bat" should have been perfect.

I thought the 36-year-old mystery melodrama classic by Mary Roberts Rinehart and Avery Hopwood got NBC-TV's "Dow Hour of Great Mysteries" off to a delightfully spooky, exciting start.

Walter Kerp's adaptation received a staging that made no attempt to conceal or soften a story that has been made to seem rather primitive and quaint with the passage of the years. In fact, the opposite was true. The production by Robert Saudek Associates used those very fundamental touches — the creaking doors, thunder, dark hallways, hidden rooms, dead bodies and furtive glances — to make "The Bat" captivating entertainment.

They don't write 'em like that anymore. (And if they do, they don't get them produced.) But the suspense-building tricks still work. The plan that scared audi-
