Detroit back in first

Tigers, Dodgers pound out wins

The Detroit Tigers are back in first place in the American League and the Los Angeles Dodgers are clawing at the National League lead today on the strength of power displays that have their rivals reeling and shell-shocked.

Pitching is supposed to be 90 per cent of the game but both the Tigers and Dodgers unleashed savage attacks Thursday night to further their pennant ambitions.

The Tigers scored a season high of eight runs in the seventh inning to whip the Baltimore Orioles, 15-8, and take over first place in the AL by one percentage ahead of the idle New York Yankees. The Dodgers, meanwhile, hammered out 14 hits, including four homers, to crush the

Cincinnati Reds, 10-1, and move within 1½ games of first place in the NL.

Colavito Hits Two

Rocky Colavito smashed his 26th and 27th homers and drove in five runs and Jake Wood also homered for the Tigers to offset two homers by Jim Gentile and one each by Brooks Robinson and Hank Foiles.

Duke Snider, Willie Davis, Wally Moon and Norm Larker all homered for the Dodgers, who dealt the Reds their fifth straight loss and made it easy for lefty Sandy Koufax to win his 12th game against six losses.

Hal Woodshick, second of four Detroit pitchers, received credit for his fourth win while Steve Barber suffered his eighth loss for the Orioles. Joey Jay, a 13-game winner, was ripped for nine runs and 10 hits in five innings, to suffer his fifth loss for the Reds.

The Cleveland Indians outslugged the Boston Red Sox, 12-11, in the only other AL game while the San Francisco Giants beat the St. Louis Cardinals, 10-6, the Milwaukee Braves downed the Philadelphia Phillies, 5-1, and the Pittsburgh Pirates defeated the Chicago Cubs, 4-0, in other NL action.

Piersall Helps Indians

Jimmy Piersall hit a three-run homer and Tito Francona added a solo homer in the seventh inning to provide the Indians with their winning margin over the

Red Sox.

Willie Mays had a single, double and eighth-inning homer as the Giants ended a five-game Cardinal winning streak.

Bob Hendley pitched a five-hitter to win his third game for the Braves, who scored three runs in the first inning before Chris Short could retire a batter.

Lefty Joe Gibbon pitched a four-hitter to win his eighth game for the Pirates behind an 11-hit attack featured by two hits each by Roberto Clemente, Dick Stuart, Don Hoak, Bill Mazeroski and Dick Schofield.

Title fight still question

NEW YORK (UPI) — Harold Johnson's manager has ostensibly approved a light-heavyweight title defense against Eddie Cotton at Seattle. But the big question today is: Will Eddie Machen and manager Sid Flaherty approve it?

Heavyweight Machen has a contract with Johnson for a return non-title match before Aug. 11. Machen and pilot Flaherty are the pair who cost Sweden's Ingemar Johansson nearly \$50,000 in attorney's fees alone before they finished return-bout litigation with him in 1959.

Johnson of Philadelphia and manager Pat Olivieri claim they prefer a title defense against Cotton at Seattle, possibly Aug. 29. Olivieri said Harold would receive a guarantee of \$20,000 from Seattle promoter George Chermers for defending his National Boxing Association share of the crown.

Johnson won a non-title 10-round decision over Machen of Portland, Ore., at Atlantic City on July 1. Their contract provided for a return bout within 40 days in case of a Johnson victory.

Injuries plague U.S. track team

LONDON (UPI) — The United States track and field team has a list of injuries a yard long, but even so, Uncle Sam's touring squad was expected to win its third straight meet when it takes on Great Britain today and Saturday at White City Stadium.

"We have an unusual list of injuries, far more than our share, in fact," said coach Jim Elliott, whose charges enter today's meet following back-to-back victories over the Soviet Union in Moscow and West Germany in Stuttgart.

A separate women's meet between the United States and Great Britain also will be held. There is some concern about the condition of Wilma Rudolph, the Tennessee State sensation who set a world record of 11.2 seconds for the 100 meters against West Germany but suffered a leg sprain.

Elliott indicated that two members of his team — Bill Sharpe of Philadelphia and John Fromm of Seattle, Wash. — are finished with competition because of injuries. Sharpe, a hop-step-and-jumper, is suffering from bursitis of the knee, and Fromm, a javelin thrower, has a pulled muscle in his side.

Sharpe and Fromm have been scratched along with pole vaulter John Uelses of the Quantic Marines, who has a leg infection, and sprinter Paul Drayton of Villanova, suffering with a muscle injury. Elliott hopes Uelses and Drayton will be rested sufficiently to compete against Poland next week.

Banks schedules eye treatment

CHICAGO (UPI) — Chicago Cub slugger Ernie Banks today began treatment designed to cure his slump-causing eye trouble.

Eye specialist Dr. Richard A. Perritt said Thursday that Banks was suffering from a loss of depth perception through lack of eye muscle coordination.

The doctor said the eye trouble, similar to that suffered by Banks in 1957, stemmed from fatigue produced by overwork.

He said it was "not serious" and was confident the muscles would respond to treatment consisting of eye exercises and drops.

Banks was not expected to return to the Cubs lineup until next Tuesday at the earliest when the team returns to Chicago.
