

7 More rabid bats discovered

SALEM (UPI)—Five more rabid bats have been found in Oregon, the State Agriculture Department said Wednesday.

Dr. George Johnson, veterinarian with the department, said a Pendleton woman and a Grants Pass man suffered bites during August. Other rabid bats were found in Wallowa, Klamath and Grant counties.

Children should be instructed to avoid contact with bats and to report any they find. The State Board of Health or county health office should be notified.

Mary Orr wishes roles were as plentiful as her plots

NEW YORK (UPI)—Mary Orr, actress, wishes that theater roles were as plentiful as plots for Mary Orr, novelist.

The blonde, blue-eyed beauty is one of those rare career women who has succeeded both on Broadway and in the book stores.

"Well, I'm hardly a trailblazer," she said in an interview. "For instance, there are Ruth Gordon and Noel Coward. Those are just two I think of who act and write too."

"The pleasant thing about doing both," said Miss Orr, "is that if you don't get the part you want in a play you can always stay home and put a book together. As I get older, I get choosier in the theater. I don't want to understudy. I don't need that any more."

Miss Orr last starred on Broadway in "The Desperate Hours." She currently is billed in publishers' lists as author of "A Place To Meet," a novel about illicit love.

Male Monopoly

"The men always seem to be writing this type of novel," she said. "Women writers tend to skip over the subject."

"I just tried to write as a woman would think and act. Few men for instance would know about a simple female worry—how your coiffure comes uncured in the rain."

Russians set off new blast

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Russia set off a nuclear explosion in the atmosphere equal to about a million tons of TNT Wednesday. It was the 14th fallout-producing blast since the Russians resumed testing Sept. 1.

The Atomic Energy Commission said Russia exploded the device in the vicinity of Novaya Zemlya, in the Arctic. It was one of the larger Russian tests since Sept. 1.

Increases in radioactive fallout were reported in several southern and midwestern states.

Mary Orr in private life is married to Reginald Denham, a Broadway director-playwright and her collaborator on a number of plays and television scripts. He directed the Broadway hits, "The Bad Seed," "Dial M for Murder" and "The Two Mrs. Carrs."

The couple has just completed adaptation for TV of "Intermezzo," which in the movie version starred Leslie Howard and Ingrid Bergman.

"Every one of our friends who reads my new book wants to know 'Mary, is it autobiographical?'" said Miss Orr. "It isn't, but when I mentioned this to my husband, I said, 'Dear, do you mind?'"

"His answer was, 'Not as long as the book makes money.'"

Won 1950 Prize

Author Orr has written a number of short stories and plays and in 1950 won the Screen Writers' Guild award for her original story which became the Academy Award motion picture "All About Eve."

The movie starred Anne Baxter and Bette Davis and also introduced a little known blonde named Marilyn Monroe.

Actress Orr, born in Brooklyn, N.Y., grew up in Canton and Cleveland, Ohio. She was graduated from Ward-Belmont College, Nashville, Tenn., and was in her first year at Syracuse University when she decided to try for a theatrical career.

Her first break on Broadway was in "Of Mice and Men" in 1938, as understudy to the star, Claire Luce. When the play went on the road, she took over the female lead.

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
