

The unkindest cut of all, he misspelled Paar's name

WASHINGTON (UPI)—There used to be a saying in show business to the effect that "I don't care what you say about me as long as you mention my name."

Later, the qualifying phrase was amended to read "as long as you spell my name right." This latter version popped into my mind as I was reading a statement issued by Rep. Edgar W. Hiestand, a California Republican who was riled over some of the activities of television's Jack Paar.

A number of lawmakers put out statements over the weekend deploring the use of U.S. troops as camera fodder for the scene that Paar filmed at the East-West border in Berlin.

But for someone in show business, Hiestand's statement must have been the unkindest cut of all.

Bit Players

Not only did Hiestand question the propriety of employing "two colonels, one lieutenant colonel, a major, a captain, two lieutenants and about 50 enlisted men" as "bit players" for Paar's late night cultural soirees.

And not only did he assert that "turning a global hot spot into a television playground" made it appear that Paar had taken over as "our new Berlin commander."

Considered by some, this criticism might have amounted to little more than extra publicity for Paar's program. But there was another factor involved.

Throughout the statement, Hiestand had the comedian's name spelled "Paar."

For what it may be worth, Paar is not the only funnyman capable of outraging a congressman. Another is Al Capp, the comic strip artist who draws "Li'l Abner."

Here of late, Capp's cartoon detective, "Fearless Fosdick," has

been engaged in a lampoon of a high-minded TV program called "The Untouchables." And this has aroused the ire of Rep. Frank J. Becker of New York.

Criticizes Episode

Becker, in a statement prepared for delivery in the House, took Capp to task for drawing an episode which showed Fosdick's boss, the chief of police, telephoning a criminal to warn of an impending raid.

"The congressman called this 'an offensive, demoralizing and grossly unfair smear of a group of extremely dedicated men.'"

"One of the primary causes of juvenile delinquency is the loss of respect and confidence in authority," he said. "If the youngsters read this kind of garbage in their funny papers, what respect are they going to have for police officers?"

Far be it from me to get involved in either of these controversies. But looking at the two statements side by side, I would say that Paar got a harder rap than Capp.

I mean, Rep. Becker might have used stronger language than Rep. Hiestand, but at least he didn't spell the cartoonist's name as "Caap."

Fight is won by lumberman

TOLEDO, Ore. (UPI)—A Toledo lumberman who went to court over the selection of an opponent for a seat on the Toledo City Council has won his fight.

Alvin Roberts was chosen by the council to fill a vacancy. The council earlier had chosen Matthew Gruber for the post, but Roberts filed a complaint in Lincoln County Circuit Court contending that Gruber had not been chosen by a majority of the six-member council.

Circuit Judge Earl Conrad ruled in favor of Roberts and ordered the council to vote again. It was this vote that brought Roberts' selection instead of Gruber.

He said telephones might go out at a critical moment, wires might be jerked out of unattended mobile radio units, bridges might be blown out on evacuation routes and Communists masquerading as policemen might appear at a road junction and steer motorists "on the road to nowhere."
