Flier believed on spy mission

ROME (UPI)—The Italian Defense Ministry said today that a Bulgarian jet fighter probably was on a spy mission when it crashed near a secret NATO missile base in Italy Saturday with photographic equipment aboard.

The ministry announcement came after Italian and American experts completed the first stage of an investigation to determine whether the armed Bulgarian jet aircraft was spying.

The Soviet built MIG-17 jet crash-landed in an olive grove 600 yards from the NATO missile base near Bari, in south Italy. The injured pilot said he wanted to ask for political asylum.

The pilot, 2nd Lt. Miluse Solakov, was being kept under heavy guard in the hospital of the Italian farming village of Aquaviva. His condition this morning was reported as "pretty good."

The Bulgarian air force plane was moved to a secret base at Gioia del Colle Wednesday night to allow Italian intelligence experts and American NATO officials to examine its parts piece by piece.

Urban affairs fight launched

WASHINGTON (UPI) — President Kennedy plunged into a showdown fight with Congress today in an emphatic bid to win approval of a new cabinet-level department of urban affairs.

The President was seeking to bypass the House Rules Committee, which voted 9-8 against a plan to create the department through legislation.

Press Secretary Pierre Salinger told reporters presidential aides were drafting a reorganization plan in hopes of sending it to Congress today. A reorganization plan takes effect automatically in 60 days unless either the House or Senate vetoes it.

Salinger said presidential aides started work on the reorganization plan Wednesday a few minutes after Kennedy told his news conference he would send the blueprint to Congress.

Kennedy told his news conference he had decided to name Housing Administrator Robert Weaver to head the new agency. Weaver would be the first Negro to hold such a high federal post.
