Nation's morale boosted by Glenn's successful flight

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Government leaders said today that astronaut John Glenn had boosted the nation's morale and proved that a free society can accomplish openly what a Communist state does secretly.

They likened the 40-year-old Marine officer to Columbus and Lindbergh and said his flight might have a pronounced effect on nations wavering between the East and the West.

"This is a magnificent tribute to our American free and open society and a contrast to the Russian closed society where space operations have been cloaked in secrecy," said House Democratic Whip Hale Boggs of Louisiana.

House Republican Leader Charles A. Halleck, of Indiana, said Russia's secrecy in its space efforts might reflect a fear of failure in eyes of the world.

Glenn trip big news in Russia

MOSCOW (UPI)—The space flight of Lt. Col. John H. Glenn Jr. was big news in Moscow today and focused attention on speculation that the Soviet Union might make a new cosmic effort in the near future.

Details of Glenn's safe recovery after orbiting the earth three times were announced here too late Tuesday night for the morning newspapers. But Russians were fully aware of the Marine's achievement through radio and television broadcasts.

Many individual Russians in Moscow gave a "khorosho" (very good) reaction to the flight, although government announcements played down the feat in comparison with the pioneer efforts of Soviet cosmonauts Yuri Gagarin and Gherman Titov.

The Soviets have not launched any known space flights since Titov orbited the earth 17 times last August. Gagarin circled the globe once last April.

The Russians have claimed that a more complex effort than the Titov flight would be made, but there has been no indication as to when this would come. There has been speculation that an attempt would be made to send a Soviet spaceman on a longer orbital voyage than Titov's, with the pilot controlling his own return to earth.

Some Western observers here felt the Soviets were holding off on new space attempts until after the Glenn flight to avoid a propaganda clash. But there was some evidence that scientific considerations were outweighing propaganda factors in determining the next space moves.

Youth wounded during capture

PORTLAND (UPI)—Charles M. Wilson, 22, Portland, was wounded by police early today after officers said they were fired at through an apartment door.

Officers F.E. Brock and Howard T. Mayhew said they were called to quell a disturbance and that a shot was fired from inside the apartment. They went upstairs for cover and said Wilson came out of the apartment, raising a .38 caliber revolver. Brock fired two shots at the man, who dropped the weapon.

The officers said a woman inside the apartment ran outside the door screaming and picked up the gun but put it down quickly when ordered to do so.

Wilson was found in the hallway with bullet wounds in his right

arm and left shoulder. He was booked on a charge of assault with intent to kill with arraignment scheduled after his release from the hospital.

CALLS IT "SHOCKING"

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Adlai E. Stevenson, U.S. ambassador to the United Nations, has described reports of Soviet persecution of Jews as "shocking."

Stevenson expressed his views Tuesday in a letter to Rep. Herbert Zelenko, D-N.Y., replying to the congressman's demand for U.N. censure of Russia. Stevenson said he was "ready to do everything" the State Department wanted.

Defense center plan favored

SALEM (UPI)—The governor's civil defense advisory council Tuesday recommended construction of an "emergency operational control center" for key figures in state government.

The Oregon civil defense agency is to include this in the budget it presents to the 1963 legislature. The center presumably would be located in the greater Salem area. There is no estimate of cost yet, but the federal government would match state funds.

The council also asked the agency to include in its next budget funds to provide group shelters in state buildings.
