TIMBER, TIMBER and MORE TIMBER

Twenty years ago, allowable cut on the Deschutes National Forest was 81,000,000 board feet annually. Today it is 136,000,000 board feet. This illustrates the progress in timber cutting in Deschutes County. It also illustrates the progress made through reforestation, use of the complete log, and through selective cutting. In addition to federal timber, most timber companies own millions of board feet of their own. There is enough timber in Deschutes County to support existing mills for another 50 years. Reforestation will continue production after that. The timber picture here is bright. The towering ponderosa pine is the hub of our economy. The huge supply of this timber will enable Deschutes County to provide jobs for thousands of men practically forever.
