Fishing good in several nearby lakes

Elk Lake is good for eastern brook and kokanee on bait or troll. It was announced this week by the Oregon Game Commission.

And the Sparks Lake campground should also be accessible by the weekend.

Fishermen can currently drive within one-half mile of Three Creeks Lake. And by this weekend, if the weather continues as at present, you can drive into the outside campground — three blocks from the lake.

Boats are now available and fishing success is good on troll and still fishing. Fish are running smaller than in past years.

Todd Lake is still blocked by snow.

East and Paulina lakes continue good on bait or troll. Bait anglers using single eggs appear to be taking slightly more fish than the trollers.

Frineville Reservoir is another good spot for trolling, while Big Lava Lake is fair to good on troll or bait. Trolling on spinner and worms has been the best producer at Big Lava.

Fishing is rated pretty good at Blue Lake. Trolling Ford feeder produces best results, with fly fishing improving.

Mud Lake is fair to good with best results obtained on small dry fly patterns using hook sizes 12 to 14.

The Deschutes River above Bend is fair to good, and lures and bait are producing best catches.

Fall River is good on bait or flies, while the Metolius River is fair to good. Dry fly patterns are best in the upper river.

Both South and North Twin Lakes are rated poor, but Wickiput Reservoir has picked up for those who troll in the shallows (3 to 6 feet of water) with lures that will float on the surface or close to the surface.
