## Prices firm up after weakening in stock market

NEW YORK (UPI) — Stocks went down for the first time in a month this week—but trading was relatively slow and prices were firming again in the final two sessions.

On Monday, the market vacillated and closed a trifle lower but on Tuesday, sellers came out in some force and demand dried up, handing the list its biggest single loss in 17 sessions.

A further moderate decline on Wednesday was wiped out by a gentle uptrend from Thursday on, reflecting a further rise to a near four-year high in the short interest, plus rumors of a special presidential news conference which never took place.

In view of growing belief that the economy might be sliding into a brief recession, brokers were little surprised and not disheartened by the setback. As one dealer put it, June business and economic statistics were "poorer than the market."

### Construction Dipped

Durable goods sales were off, personal income and industrial production leveled out, and construction — recently a bulwark — dipped quite sharply. Only auto production held up well.

Steel imports in May reached a two-year high, the administration's earlier estimate of 1962 gross national product was lowered, and strike threats developed in a number of new quarters — notably missiles and rails.

Although prices went down, Wall Street sagged still were mildly optimistic at weekend, noting that the nearest technical resistance barrier—570-75 in the Dow-Jones industrial average—proved strong enough to stem the selling. A second and probably stronger line of defense would be in the 550s, the lows of the May 29 debacle.

### Time to Watch

Many now expect investors to sit back and watch for a few weeks, leaving in-and-out traders to guide the destiny of the market. With this thesis in mind, the best guesses available were that a series of quiet zig-zag movements would now be seen.

The only things the experts saw ahead likely to alter the picture radically would be a dividend cut by Bethlehem and/or U.S. Steel, or an administration decision to try to ram an immediate tax cutting measure through Congress.

The inclusive Standard & Poor's 500 stock index ended the week at 56.81 down 1.02 on the week. This was the equivalent of a loss of \$3.4 billion in paper values, the agency said.

In the Dow-Jones averages, industrials fell 13.01 of 577.18, rails lost 2.23 to 123.05 and utilities slumped 1.13 to 113.56.

Trading over the five-day period amounted to 15,962,490 shares compared with 23,073,400 shares a week ago and 13,552,340 in the like period of 1961.

Notice is hereby given that: A petition has been filed by the Oregon Roadside Council, M. J. Vennewitz, Agent, P. O. Box 8717, Portland 7, Oregon, that certain areas hereinafter designated be designated as Scenic Areas for the reason that the area is an area of scenic grandeur.  
The areas are more particularly described as follows, to-wit:  
A. US 20 from the US 97 junction near Bend to the US 126 junction near Sisters.  
B. US 126 from the west city limits of Redmond to the US 20 junction near Sisters.  
C. US 97 from the north city limits of Terrebonne to the south city limits of Madras.  
D. US 20 from the old Bend-Burns Road junction in Section 36, T18S, R13E, W.M. to the town of Millican, a distance of about 12 miles.  
Any areas legally exempted are understood to be excluded from the above.
