

DALLAS (UPI) — If confidence means anything, the six-point underdog role to be played by the Dallas Texans in Sunday's American Football League championship game at Houston against the Oilers won't mean a thing.

The Texans, Western Division titlists after two years as poor runners up to the San Diego Chargers, aren't cocky. But they are confident.

"We feel we don't have a weak link anywhere," says all-league linebacker E. J. Holub, whose poor experience matches that of the three-year old AFL.

"Everybody has confidence — in himself and in everyone else," Holub said in discussing the Texans' prospects for an upset over the Oilers team that has swept to two consecutive league titles.

"This club has developed so this season that you don't have to worry about having to do another man's job as well as your own," he added.

**Shrine players all drafted by AFL, NFL clubs**

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)— Nearly every one of the 44 football players competing in the Shrine East-West game this year have been drafted by either the National or American Football Leagues.

But it is probable that none has more of a desire to make good than young Jim Moss, a good-looking, 6-1, 205 pound halfback from Huntington, W. Va.

"That's my ambition," says the 21-year-old star, "to play professional football."

"I've never seen a game in my life, except on television. But I've been drafted by the New York Giants (No. 13) and the Oakland Raiders (No. 16). I think maybe I'll take a crack at it with the Giants."

Giants or Raiders? "I want to play pro football. And I want to make it big. I know it will be tough to make it with the Giants. But I've got to try. Then after I'm through with playing football, I will settle down to coaching it. It's the game I love."

Moss is typical of the youngsters who are giving up their Christmas vacation to perform in the Shrine game. Most of them were a little homesick when they first came to San Francisco. But after a visit to the Shrine Hospital for crippled children Thursday they forget all about that, and realize the value in playing the All-Star game on Dec. 29.

Hugh Campbell, the great Washington State end who was drafted fourth and signed by the San Francisco Forty Niners, is on the West squad. Some players and some coaches complain that he's too slow to make it big in the pro ranks.

"Don't worry about that," says his college coach, Jim Sutherland. "Hugh isn't as slow as some people think. For 50 yards he was the fourth fastest man on my squad."

"But in addition to that, in a one-on-one situation, he will always be able to get away from the man guarding him."

"When Hugh catches the ball, he'll hang onto it. And he'll maneuver enough to get in the clear so the quarterback will have a target at which to throw. No, he's not the fastest man in the world. And he won't run 50 or 60 yards for a touchdown after he catches the ball. But he'll make the grade. Wait and see."

George Saimers, Michigan State's great back, was drafted No. 6 by the Los Angeles Rams. But he was signed by the Buffalo Bills of the American League.

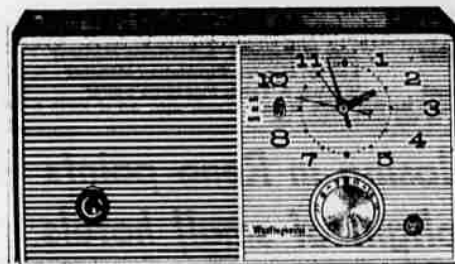

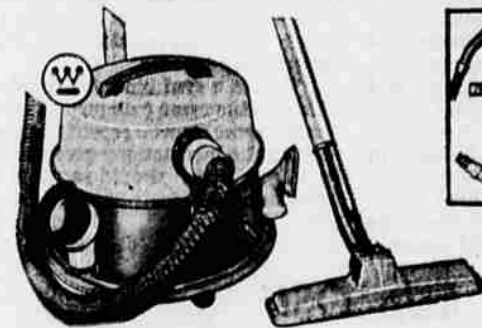
