Joyce Terry

Jan. 13, 1931 – Feb. 9, 2015

Joyce (Warnock) Terry was born Jan. 13, 1931, and left this earth Feb. 9, 2015. She and her twin sister Jean (Warnock) Huffman were born to Dave & Ena Warnock in the old doctor's office/hospital in Wallowa, delivered by Dr. Gregory. At that time, the family lived up the Southfork River outside Lostine. When the girls were in the second grade, they moved to the family ranch on Warnock Road between Lostine and Wallowa. They attended school from second grade through high school in Lostine, riding horseback three miles to school each way. After high school, Joyce attended college in La Grande studying music.



Joyce married her high school sweetheart, Lawrence Edwin Terry, on June 14, 1950. They lived in Elgin for a short time while Lawrence logged, returning to the ranch where she was raised and operated the family's cattle ranch. Lawrence joined the US Army and served for 21 months, during which time the couple resided in several different states. They returned to the ranch in 1956 after Lawrence was honorably discharged.

Joyce lived her life in service, both to her community and to her family. She cared for both her parents late in their lives, her father-in-law, two aunts and an elderly neighbor. She served the Lostine Presbyterian Church by playing the piano and organ, singing in the choir, providing flowers, and supporting the church in whatever role she was asked. She taught music lessons and played piano for the Lostine and Wallowa School choirs.

Joyce enjoyed painting, crocheting and quilting.

Together with her husband, they raised three daughters, Cathy Ann (Terry) Johnson, Connie Marie (Terry) Howard and Donna Lee Terry. Lawrence and Joyce operated Terry's Building Supply for 15 years, serving the livestock and building needs of the County. Lawrence later drove logging truck.

Joyce maintained the Lostine Cemetery records for decades. Together with others, they have provided headstones for those buried generations ago whose graves bore no markers. Joyce enjoyed bowling, kept books for the Lostine Ditch Company, took painting classes throughout the western states, and was involved in the Wallowa School Foundation.

After the death of their youngest daughter, Donna Lee on April 24, 1984, they donated a \$20,000 life insurance policy to a private foundation which funded scholarships for 10 years.

Joyce is survived by her husband, Lawrence Terry of Lostine, twin sister, Jean Huffman of Walla Walla, Wash.; daughters Cathy Johnson and husband Dick Johnson of Lostine and Connie Howard and Donald Howard of Portland; seven grandchildren and many great-grandchildren. Her service was held at the Lostine Presbyterian Church on Feb. 13, 2015. It was attended by 150 people and conducted by Rev. Steve Kliever.

A good student in all academic areas with excellent study skills, Roan has participated in Battle of the Books over the past two years and is currently reading and preparing for this year's competition. He is also active after school participating in soccer and baseball.

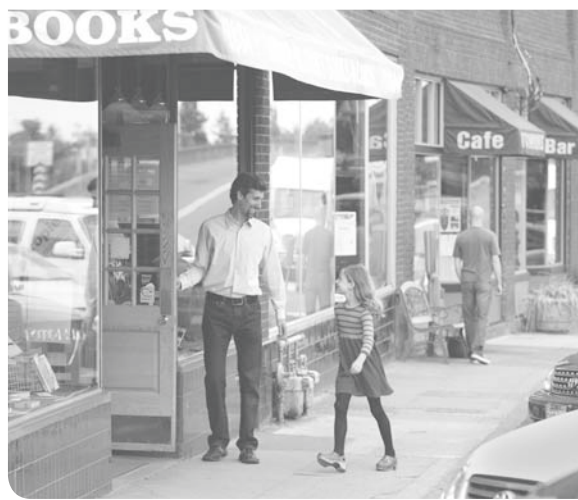
Roan's favorite books
