Few ranchers are in the directories so their representations are smaller, found some by word of mouth; but the ones who have the trail through their property are not as happy as the entities at the meeting infer. Being property owners ourselves we have dealt with trespass, opened gates, etc. but haven't involved the sheriff's department. We took care of it ourselves. I'm assuming the ranchers or other land owners along the WNT do the same. Those that I talked to use no trespass signs, lock gates, removing offenders if found etc. On the other hand

some might not mind the trail. I found one who was against now accepts it, except for a strange comment he made at the end of our conversation stating, "it might have been better not to have had it at all." He didn't elaborate further and I didn't question him.

A business that the trail group used stated that it didn't make that much difference to their business. They also gave advice about forming a group to discourage the trail before it is a reality.

On another note: Am I the only one who thought the rail corridor was protected by purchasing it? If so, how can a trail preserve it any further? In

ignorance I assumed the trail issue was laid to rest with the excursion train; then I read the Vision Statement of WURA and the Joseph Trail group which states the third bullet down that a rail and trail was, among others an objective! If others are in the same boat as I was, perhaps it's time for all of us to be informed, involved and trust less. I would recommend interested persons to read the vision statement.

Carol McRae and husband Dallas McCrae, who currently live close to the WURA rail corridor in Wallowa, formerly owned a ranch that was bisected by the rail line.
