The Cougars, for their part, managed to make some noise in the bottom of the first.

With a runner at first and two outs, Micah Fuller blasted one over the right fielder's head for a double. Wallowa's next batter made an out, however, stranding the Cougars' runners at second and third.

From that point forward, the game quickly became a blowout with Ent/Jos plating six runs in the second, seven in the third, and two in the fourth for a 17-0 lead, and then deep-freezing it completely with another six-run outburst in the fifth.

In his five-inning shutout, Eagles starting pitcher Sam Beckman gave up four hits, struck out 10, and walked no one.

A number of Eagles produced run-scoring hits in the contest. The parade included Riley Hayward, who had a two-run single in the first and a one-run single in the third; Jean-Luc Palma, who had a two-run single in the third; Dylan Thompson, who singled for a run in the third; and Devin McQuead, who produced the most damage, driving in two in the first, one in the third, and two in the fifth.

McQuead's two-game stats for Saturday: 6-for-9, 9 RBIs, 2 runs scored. Eagles coach Calvin Word additionally praised McQuead for his smooth defense at first base. Generally, the entire team has been playing well in the field. "We've only had three errors in the last three games," Word noted.

The Eagles (2-4 league record; 6-11 overall) will host Union this Friday for a doubleheader. The Cougars (0-6 league; 2-12 overall) were slated to finish up with two games at Grant Union on Tuesday.
