EAGLES' SEASON ENDS ON A WIN

Wallowa boys' golf team a state qualifier

PENDLETON — Led by senior Karl Wellens' two-round total of 166 strokes — good for fifth place individually — the Wallowa/Joseph boys' golf team qualified for state at the 3A-2A-1A District 3 tourney in Pendleton, Monday and Tuesday, May 11-12.

The Marvin Gibbs-coached Cougars team, one of four to qualify for state, finished second at 764 strokes, behind Nixyaawii at 722. Heppner was third at 774, and Vale's two-day score of 780 edged out Grant Union (784) for the final spot.

The Enterprise boys' squad, which shot 835, finished seventh among the tourney's nine teams.

On the girls' side, meanwhile, La Grande and Heppner/Ione were the only state qualifiers in a District 3 tour-

ney that additionally included 4A schools. Enterprise came in fourth among nine full teams, and Wallowa golfer Claire Wellens, who shot a two-day total of 248, had no teammates.

The Lady Outlaws' total was 864.

Karl Wellens completed the par-72 course in 84 strokes on day one, and in 82 strokes the second day. Teammates Alex Coutant (95, 92) and Kai Oliver 96, 91) both shot 187, Caevan Murray (115, 109) 224, and alternate Thomas Jamerson (129, 122) 251.

Enterprise girls' individual scores: Carsen Sajonia (93, 93) 186, Emma Hall (109, 109) 218, Stefany Christman (116, 114) 230, Jackie Jenson (114, 116) 230, and alternate Gracie Carlsen (128, 126) 254.

Despite facing endless rain and soggy baseballs, the Joseph/Enterprise baseball team ended the season on a high note, winning the bottom end of a May 15 dou-

Ent/Wal track men take district

Lady Outlaws finish fourth, send five to state

JOHN DAY — Enterprise and Wallowa track and field men participating under the Outlaws team banner ran away with the Wapiti League district title May 15 at Grant Union High School. The Ent/Wal men collected 168 points for a comfortable margin over second-place Burns' 140, and

the Lady Outlaws didn't fare badly either, finishing fourth in their division with 87 points.

The Outlaw men won the district trophy without the services of star teammate Micah Fuller, who had figured to qualify for state in discus and shot put, and who would have run the final leg of the 4x400 relay, which was run by Nathan Perren instead. Fuller suffered a foot injury last week and didn't make the trip to John Day.

Meanwhile another star performer for the Enterprise men, Kaden Lathrop, wasn't at 100 percent as he continues to nurse a hamstring that he tweaked a couple of weeks ago. Lathrop still qualified for state in both the 300-meter hurdles and high jump, however.

Also headed to state among the men are Daniel Kohlhepp (shot put, discus), Nathan Perren (high jump, 4x100 relay), Rocky Davidson (long jump), and members of the 4x100 re-

lay team (Brandon Frolander, Perren, James Madsen and Chandler Burns).

State-qualifying women include Eliza Irish (800 meters), Dawn Mist Movich-Fields (1500 and 3000), Andrea Butterfield (discus), and members of the 4x400 relay squad (Nohr, Irish, Kari Rose and Riley Gray).

The Outlaws competed well in spite of the day's persistent rain.
