## Joseph women win district trophy

### Boys qualify pole vaulter Raymond Seal for state meet

After a winning performance at the 1A District Championships held in Baker City on May 14, the Joseph girls track team is sending six of its members to state. Raymond Seal was the lone qualifier on the boys team, taking second place in the pole vault.

Isabelle Tingelstad led the way for the Lady Eagles winning both the 1500 and 3000 meter races as





well as participating in the winning 4x400 relay race. Sophomore Ally Cooney placed first in the high

jump, first in the javelin and second in the triple jump.

Freshman Alexa Sykora placed first in the 800 meters and sophomore Johnelle Suto placed second in the 400 meters. Other second place winners going on to state include senior Sarah Thiel in the pole vault and senior Kari Zollman in the javelin.

Tingelstad, Sykora, Suto and Cooney were members of the winning 4x400 relay team.

The Joseph girls team won the

district title with 179 points. Second-place Crane scored 140.

The state meet takes place in Eugene on May 21-22.
