

Sylvia Tippett drowns in creek

100 YEARS AGO
May 27, 1915

Caught in the spring torrent in Joseph creek, Mrs. Sylvia Tippett, wife of J.H. (Jidge) Tippett, was drowned Sunday afternoon while trying to save her husband from the stream. Her body was recovered yesterday and is now on the way to Enterprise ... Full details of the tragedy have not come from the canyons, as none of the searchers have returned, and there is no telephone reaching to lower Joseph creek. From

the reports sent out, it seems that Mr. and Mrs. Tippett had been for several days at G.W. Salladay's, seven or eight miles from their home east of Joseph creek and near the state line. They had been fishing. Sunday afternoon they started home, and came to the ford near Bob Haskins' place, a mile above where Joseph creek empties into the Grande Ronde. The creek was still a torrent, and Jidge concluded to ride in to see if his horse could make it. The animal was swept off its feet and he fell into the rapid

stream. His wife, a splendid rider, rode into the creek and tried to throw a rope to him. It seems that was the last he ever saw of her. The current carried him down stream and out of sight, and some distance below he was washed against the bank and crawled out.

The largest crowd ever gathered in Wallowa county assembled yesterday afternoon at the fair grounds to see the Al G. Barnes animal circus. J.F. Morrow of the show management estimated that there were not less than 4200 persons in the tent.

70 YEARS AGO
May 24, 1945

Mr. and Mrs. R.J. Surber of west Greenwood street received a telegram on Wednesday of last week stating that their son, Pfc. Virgil F., had died on Negros island in the Philippines from wounds received in action on April 26. Virgil was born in Enterprise and attended school here. He worked with the CCC for awhile and enlisted in the army in December, 1941.

Word was received last week that Lt. Ray Pierson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Winfred M. Pierson of La Grande and husband of the former Mary Jane Faucette of Enterprise, had been missing since May 3 in a flight over India and China. Lt. Pierson, a graduate of Eastern Oregon college of education, was the pilot of a C-46 plane.

50 YEARS AGO
May 27, 1965

The selection of a queen for Chief Joseph Days has been made. Miss Sharon Dougherty, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Bill Dougherty of Wallowa, was

announced as the winner at the queen selection dance at Joseph Saturday night. Members of her court include two princesses, Kitty Loftus of Enterprise and Sharon Sorweide of Joseph.

Unless recent rains have appreciably dampened the spirits of the Wallowa county citizens, a large crowd can be expected to be on hand for the events of the Spring Fair which begins today and continues through Saturday. It is expected that there will be about 200 individual exhibitors in the various phases of competition. Both 4-H and FFA will take part in the spring fair.

The snow pack of the high Wallowa mountains still stands at a record high water content according to measurements made on May 15 ... At Aneroid course No. 1 the snow measures 80 inches and the water content 46 inches ... The highest previous reading for the Aneroid course on May 15 shows a figure of 45.6 on course No. 1 in 1952.

Ben Peal, who had lived in Wallowa county most of his life until he was seriously injured in a logging accident near Joseph in 1956, passed away in a Walla Walla hospital on Friday, May 21, 1965. He had been paralyzed since the accident.

25 YEARS AGO
May 24, 1990

The Oregon Elections Division is investigating allegations that Mary Goebel Grote, who unseated incumbent District Attorney Bill Reynolds in the May 15 Oregon primary election, falsely stated that she is occupied as an attorney in a report filed with the Oregon Elections Division. That statement was subsequently published in the 1990 Oregon Voter's Pamphlet compiled and distributed by Secretary of State Barbara Roberts. "We're looking into the allegation that she may have inappropriately used the term attorney in advertising and the Voter's Pamphlet," said elections division director Jack Graham ... The issue of whether Grote becomes District attorney is not connected to the investigation and the alleged elections violations, according to Graham.
