

### Cougars eye another state run

WALLOWA — Cougars football made an impressive comeback last year, compiling a 7-3 won-loss record and reaching the state quarterfinals, where Wallowa lost to Dufur.

For 2015, second-year Head Coach Matt Brockamp has it in mind to build upon last year's success, and he has good reason to believe this is a realistic expectation.

"We have eight returning First Team All-League players, so we're going to be better than we were last year, I think," Brockamp explains.

Furthermore, the Cougars aren't just looking to strike it rich for only a year or two. "My incoming freshman class is loaded with talent," Brockamp says, "so we're going to be a good football team for several years to come."

The return of good times for Wallowa football is also reflected in the growing number of bodies in uniform. Last season the program dressed 18 at the outset. This year's squad is up to 22. The maximum allowed is 24.

Brockamp, assisted by coaches Mel Byers and Jeremy McCulloch, defensive coordinator, plans to continue to exploit last year's established strengths while adding some new wrinkles.
