# Nine serving with U.S. forces in Saudi Arabia

### **100 YEARS AGO** October 7, 1915

By order of the Public Service commission of Oregon, the city of Enterprise is empowered to extend Depot street south across the tracks of the O-W railroad. The extension will run close to the east end of the Woolgrowers' warehouse, and will give the city an outlet to the south and southwest now lacking. At a hearing set in Enterprise, the railroad objected strenuously, on the ground that the proposed crossing would be dangerous. The city took the ground that it wanted the crossing at Depot street or not at all.

The people of Flora are to be congratulated on their new schoolhouse, occupied now for the first time. It is the newest, and in many respects the best school building in the county, as regards completeness and efficiency of equipment.




