## 100 YEARS AGO Oct. 28, 1915

The largest blocks of stone ever brought in from the Bowlby quarry east of Swamp Creek are being hauled for the prospective store building of the E.M.&M. company. One block weighs 4,014 pounds and another 3,700. Four such stones are called for in the plans of the building
