Oct. 25, 1990

Dr. Lowell Euhus of Enterprise received the Outstanding Rural Provider of the Year award at the 7th Annual Oregon Rural Health Conference in La Grande last weekend. Dr. Euhus, Wallowa County physician for 18 years, was lauded for his leadership role in tackling rural health problems on the state level the past two-plus years.

Chad Aschenbrenner of Enterprise placed seventh in the boys race and Amy Williams of Joseph was eleventh on the girls side of the McKay Invitational Cross Country meet held in Pendleton Oct. 18. Aschenbrenner ran to an 18:15.34 finish in the boys 5,000 meter event, while Williams completed the girls 3,000 meter run in 12:49.35.

A Wallowa County Court resolution proclaiming October as Adult Foster Care Month in the county acknowledges a quiet revolution that has taken place in the care and housing of the elderly in recent years. While only two adult foster homes existed in the county as recently as 1984, there are now seven licensed homes currently serving up to 34 residents. There are also nine relative foster homes in the county, where relatives serve as a caregiver to one family member. According to the most recent estimate, 27 percent of county residents are over the age of 60.
