13 films debut at 'best ever' 48-Hour festival

It's a wrap, and a party. The 4th Annual Ruby Peak 48-Hour Film Festival wrapped up Monday night at the OK Theatre with 13 out of 14 film companies turning in their productions.


The crowd filled the theater and the night was filled with applause.
