Panthers sweep JEF Invite

Joseph teams go 1-1 at weekend fundraiser

This year's JEF Invitational Tournament was a bit of a rollercoaster ride for the host Eagles.

Friday's opening games had the Joseph girls winning big — really big — over the visiting Wildcats of Wilder, Idaho, and the Joseph boys holding off Wilder in a nail-biter that was easily the weekend's best game.

Saturday was a tougher test, though, as both teams lost to solid Imbler squads from the 2A Wapiti League.

The annual tournament is a fundraiser for the Joseph Education Foundation. Foundation Secretary Dena Miller said Tuesday that the Invitational raised nearly \$3,350 for the JEF.

In the boys title game Saturday, Imbler stormed out to a 14-2 lead at the end of the first quarter and never looked back, claiming the tournament trophy with a 54-15 victory.
