The Wallowa Valley Chorale will be presenting a spring concert at the historic OK Theatre at 6 p.m. Sunday, April 17.

The concert is free, although donations will be gladly accepted, as the Chorale is supported by these concert donations.

The spring concert program is an eclectic mix of classic rock songs, such as the Mamas and the Papas' "California Dreamin'" and the Beatles' "Blackbird" as well as folk songs such as "Camp-town Races" and "Goin' Home" from the New World Symphony. There also will be some contemporary Easter songs, such as "Forsaken" and "I Will Rise". The program

also will feature Gail Swart performing Chopin's "Etude in Ab" on the piano.

The Wallowa Valley Chorale has been in existence in one form or another since at least the 1950s.

The group has always in-

cluded singers from all reaches of Wallowa County, and spanned a wide variety of musical genres, ranging from religious and classical, to popular music, including folk music and classic rock.

In recent years, the Chorale has been directed by

Claudia Boswell, Iva Lindsey and Randy Morgan. Currently, Morgan is the only conductor.

The Chorale typically performs two concerts a year, one in the spring and one in the fall.

The group also has per-

formed with the Inland Northwest Musicians and the Wallowa Valley Orchestra. Singers of all ages are welcome to participate, and the Chorale is always looking for more singers.

Rehearsals typically start in late September.

- ❖ 1 out of every 6 women in the US has been the victim of rape in her lifetime.
- ❖ 1 in 33 men in the US has been the victim of rape in his lifetime.
- ❖ 44 percent of lesbians and 61 percent of bisexual women experience rape, physical violence, or stalking by an intimate partner.
- ❖ 26 percent of gay men and 37 percent of bisexual men experience rape, physical violence, or stalking by an intimate partner.
- ❖ One in 4 girls and 1 in 6 boys will be Sexually Assaulted by the age of 18

Is any non-consensual sex act. A Non-consensual means a person is unable to grant consent or an act that is unwanted and compelled through the use of, physical force, manipulation, coercion, threats, and/or intimidation. Consent is a "yes" when "no" is a viable option.
