### 100 YEARS AGO April 13, 1916

• The flume leading to the planing mill of the Wilson Lumber company collapsed for about 100 feet last night. The planks and heavy supports were broken into many pieces and were scattered about the ground. This morning the mill is without power.

• School notes: The triangle county debate (Wallowa, Enterprise & Joseph) will take place Friday of this week. The question is the independence of the Philippine Islands.

### 70 YEARS AGO April 18, 1946

• Mr. and Mrs. Fred Botts narrowly escaped death early this month when the cable holding the basket in

which they were crossing the Grande Ronde river broke. One strand of the cable held, by which Botts was able to pull the basket to shore.

• Anson Rugg, who recently received his discharge from the service, has opened the Wallowa hotel. New equipment has been installed

and the hotel modernized throughout. This hotel was originally the old Northern hotel.

• A car driven by Kenneth Zollman went over the grade on the hill west of Enterprise Saturday night and overturned. The car was damaged considerably but the occupants escaped with minor injuries. In the car besides the driver were Katherine Barklow, Vera Jean Brooks and Norman McCrae.

### 50 YEARS AGO April 14, 1966

• Photo caption: Things were getting done in a hurry at the golf course north of Enterprise when five men from the Boise Cascade Corp. with heavy equipment moved in to grade the grounds in preparation for new grass greens and other extensive improvements which are involved in a \$30,000 improvement program at the course.

• Weather permitting, many years of history will go up in smoke early Sunday when the Enterprise Fire Department razes the old blacksmith shop at the corner of East First and North Street in Enterprise. The building and lot were purchased by Pacific Power and Light Co. late last year and it is their plan to use the site for the construction of a new building to house the local power office.
