The Hells Canyon Mule Days board of directors recently awarded \$1,000 scholarships to three Wallowa County high school seniors.

This year's scholarships were granted to:

• Emily George of Wallowa High School, daughter of Richard and Valerie George. Emily will attend Oregon State University in Corvallis with a major in psychology.

• Will McCadden of Enterprise High School, son of Kevin and Melanie McCadden. Will plans to attend Washington State University in Pullman and study sports management.

• Natalie Williams of Joseph Charter School, daughter of Robert and Stephanie Williams. Natalie plans to attend Oregon State University and major in Bio-Health Sciences.

The first annual Max Walker Memorial Scholarship was given in the 2004-2005 school year for one scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 and was awarded to Wallowa High School student Lindsay Easom.

With the continuing success of the Hells Canyon Mule Days event and the board's focus on supporting local youth, the board made the decision in 2006 to increase the number of scholarships to three \$1,000 awards starting for 2006-2007 school year. 
