Etta L. Conner of Tutuilla, Ore., passed away May 20, 2016, in Portland. Etta was born in Pendleton to Elsie (Spokane) and Gilbert Edward Conner on April 9, 1934. Her parents named her Wyassus (Dance) after her maternal grandmother. She graduated from Pendleton High School, then earned a Bachelor of Arts in administration of justice at Portland State University.



Becoming an adult during the federal Indian Relocation Act era, Etta lived in Colorado Springs, Albuquerque and Los Angeles. A long-time resident of Portland, she worked at the PSU School of Social Work and sold Avon while being an industrious homemaker. While there, she was secretary-treasurer of the Portland Indian Rodeo Association and a ski-racer in slalom and downhill with club Ski-ente’.

Besides being an avid aqua-aerobics regular at the Pendleton RAC, she was also an oil painter and amateur cinematographer. Etta was devoted to camping at the annual Wallowa Tamkaliks Celebration and the Pendleton Round-Up tipi encampment. She also was a long-time volunteer in the Happy Canyon Pageant. With her brother Taz and sisters, she helped revitalize the Indian participation in Chief Joseph Days and supported the launch of Tamkaliks in Wallowa.

She was preceded in death by son Gilbert John Lewis, her parents, two sisters and four brothers.

She is survived by her elder sister Leah Conner of Pendleton; daughters Jennifer Mesteth (Mark) of Irrigon, Deborah Carter of San Diego, Marcia Sorini (Greg) of San Diego, Lonna Lewis and Clay Christiansen of Pendleton, Leanna Lewis (Keith Burke) of Pendleton and Cami El Shoura (Eslam) of Pendleton; sons Edward Joseph Lewis (Kathy) of Spokane and Kipp Lewis (Leanne) of Las Vegas; 20 grandchildren and 20 great-grandchildren.

A funeral service will be held at 2 p.m. Sunday, May 22 at Tutuilla Presbyterian Church in Pendleton. An interment service will be held at 10 a.m. Monday, May 23 at Olney Cemetery. Dinner will follow at approximately noon at the Mission Longhouse.

Reita Maxine (Murrey) Lockett

Reita Maxine Lockett, 93, of McMinnville passed peacefully of natural causes on April 21 with family and friends by her side. Reita spent her childhood years on the slopes of the Wallowa Mountains near Enterprise as a “little farm girl,” milking cows, gathering eggs, walking lengthy distances in all kinds of weather to school or to town, drying clothes on a line and using an outhouse. Her resourceful mother taught her to sew, recycle and use her imagination while balancing a hard-working lifestyle with pleasurable activities. This created wonderful memories she shared with her own children through the years. As a young adult she had her sights set on missionary work, traveling to Portland to attend seminary and work with the homeless. However, one of Reita’s most inspiring “ah-ha” moments was when a professor noticed her talent as a teacher. As a result, a whole new chapter opened for her. She met her future partner in life, Jim Lockett, at Eastern Oregon College. They married in 1950 at the First Baptist Church of Enterprise and then moved to McMinnville, where new jobs at Columbus School awaited. She had a long career in education. An active member of First Baptist Church of McMinnville, she continued her ministry work in “purpose and people” through American Baptist Women, Guild for girls, original Hillside Manor



marketing, Soroptimists, church choir, hospital volunteer, PEO sisterhood, the local Historical Society and Sister Circle, to name a few. Throughout her life she felt a special calling to the elderly and adopted many as dear friends. In her later years she served as a surrogate mother for many who had lost their own. She loved unconditionally and found good in everyone’s spirit, young and old. She will be greatly missed, held close in our hearts and remembered by many. Reita was preceded in death by her husband Jim, her parents Harley and Vinita Murrey, and two sisters — Evelyn Wagner and Geri Bornstedt. She is survived by children Becki Lockett Heath of Portland and her son Evan; Janie Lockett Burich (Bill) of Salem and their children Nikolas and Tracie; Katie Lockett Foster (Dave) of Parkdale, Ore., and their children Shannon and Jerry; great-granddaughter Talula James Foster; devoted companion Peg Hegna also survives her.
