From now on, if you're entering Enterprise from the west, there's little doubt you'll know exactly which town is directly ahead.

Several dozen people gathered on a cool, gray morning Friday to witness the much anticipated unveiling of a years-long push to erect the city's new welcome sign.

Members of Greater Enterprise Main Streets (GEMS) celebrated the achievement with a gathering at the top of the hill overlooking Enterprise from the west on Highway 82 (across from Eagle's View Inn & Suites).

The monument, four years in the making, was

completed through the effort and support of many. From individual donations to larger contributions — from Community Bank, Pacific Pow-


er, Wallowa County, Glenn Martin, the Wallowa County Cultural Trust and the city of Enterprise — the project was truly a community effort.

The monumental sign was crafted from products that reflect Enterprise. The Bowlby stone, quarried by Melville Stone, ties in to the historic buildings downtown. The wood represents the importance of natural resource economy (timber, farming, ranching, outdoor recreation). The wood was locally harvested and produced by JayZee lumber and was carved and painted by local artist Steve Arment. Engineer Ralph Swinehart generously drew up the blueprints needed. Darrell Brann was involved in the design committee work, organized the construction and laid the Bowlby stone columns with help from Tim Funk and others.




