SPECIMEN: A single bloom, spike, stalk or plant

SPIKE: A stalk carrying many stemless or nearly stemless flowers

SPRAY: A portion of a plant with a number of flowers on one stem

STALK: Stiff stem which may branch, with one or more flowers.
