100 YEARS AGO June 1, 1916

• Notices have been posted and the petitions filed with the county court for the opening of the long proposed road to the Innaha down Brushy canyon and Big and Little Sheep creeks. The matter will come before the county court for hearing at the July term.

• Advertisement: The E. M. & M. Company – the store that wants you to feel at home. When out shopping if you do not want to buy anything, why just sit and rest and meet friends and when you return home you will feel better for having been in our store.

• The body of George W. Freeman, for six weeks employed at A. F. Arnold's home place on Big Sheep creek, was found floating in the stream Tuesday afternoon, half a mile above the Innaha. Mr. Freeman had been missing since last Thursday. A jury ... recommended that George L. Lockett, a shepherd working for Mr. Arnold, be held until a further examination was made of the body to ascertain whether there was any reason to suspect foul play.

• Turning his automobile into a combined police patrol and ambulance, Dr. C. T. Hockett yesterday brought in two men from the crew working on railroad extensions for

the East Oregon company. One of them he placed in the hospital and the other was lodged in the county jail as a city prisoner. Aleck Papolus, a Greek, was the one put in the hospital, he having been stabbed by the other, a Turk. His wounds are not serious.

70 YEARS AGO June 6, 1946

• M. Keith Wilson of Joseph last week received from the French provisional government a communication awarding him the French Croix de Guerre medal for distinguished services rendered in the liberation of France while serving overseas with the 90th division. Mr. Wilson also has

the Purple Heart, Bronze Star with cluster, Silver Star, ETO service medal with five bronze stars, and the combat infantryman's badge.

• The circus which visited Enterprise last Saturday, giving afternoon and evening performances at the fairgrounds, was well patronized. It is estimated that nearly 1,500 persons attended the afternoon show.

• The Wallowa library is now open again after being closed a month for a thorough cleaning. The walls have been kem-toned and new linoleum is to be laid when it is available. Twelve new books have been recently added to the shelves.

• R. T. Sanders of Wallowa while fishing in Kinney Lake last Friday hooked a 14-inch goldfish, which has been put in the fountain pool at the

lodge at the lake. Mr. Sanders was fortunate in having a can with him so that he could keep the fish alive until he got it to town. Mr. Raner of the fish commission here said that the fish was an ordinary goldfish that had grown up. How it ever happened to be in Kinney lake is anybody's guess.

50 YEARS AGO June 2, 1966

• Lightning danced around the hills in the Troy area on Monday afternoon and about 3:30 a bolt struck in the bottom of the canyon causing quite a little excitement. The stray bolt set fire to a house owned by Bernice Lotts of Hood River. Two men were in the house at the time and both were knocked to the floor but were not injured otherwise.

Guide will help patients estimate procedure prices

The Oregon Association of Hospitals and Health Systems (OAHHS) announced this month that every Oregon hospital can provide a cost estimate for hospital services for a scheduled procedure within three business days.

This is a voluntary policy helps uninsured or out-of-network patients to understand their potential costs for services provided at the hospital.

Most insured patients, however, will find more useful information on costs by contacting their insurer, who can provide specific estimates based on their particular plan.

OAHHS also announced that the OregonHospitalGuide.org website now features a "Cost Estimates" section for each hospital in the state. This new section provides comprehensive information for consumers to contact hospital cost estimate and billing departments. It also links directly to each hospital's financial assistance policy, which can be helpful for people who need help paying their bill.

"Patients, whether they are insured, out of their health plan's network or lack insurance all together, should be able to get a good faith estimate directly from their hospital for the cost of a procedure ahead of time," said Andy Davidson, OAHHS President and CEO. "We are

very proud of this pro-consumer commitment by Oregon hospitals."
