Competitors in the marathon swimming event at the Olympics will go 10k — just over 6 miles — in their quest for gold.

Sarah Dealy, 18, will do even better on Wednesday, Aug. 31, when she plans to do a 7-mile swim at Wallowa Lake to help raise money for the impoverished children of Haiti.

Dealy recently moved to Wallowa County from Bellingham, Wash., and has made serious swims before, but it's all about the charity for her.

Last year, she swam 8 miles across Bellingham Bay and raised \$7,000 for a local foster children's organization.

It was tough and it took nine months of training. So, although Dealy is an excellent swimmer and had all

that experience under her belt, that preparation meant a lot of sacrifice she wasn't sure she could do again. She thought her Bellingham Bay swim was a one-off she would feel good about for the rest of her life.

Wallowa County. And saw Wallowa Lake. At the same time, her roommate and good friend, Hannah Farris, visited Haiti and learned that the construction of Grace Academy — a school in Mirebalais, Haiti, serving 250 students — was nearly complete.

The project simply needed money to complete the roof. So, the two women partnered up to raise money for that roof.

Dealy will swim 3.5 miles out and back on Wallowa Lake, and Farris will accompany her in a kayak for safety.
