tured engraved signs. Kirk loved his church and his friends he met through the Lord, but due to his health and eyesight challenges he decided to move to Joseph in February of 2015 to be near his sister Shelly Steen. In Joseph, Kirk met a new church family where

he continued living and serving the Lord. Kirk loved all of his friends and family but his boys and their families were his pride and joy. He always looked forward to the next text picture or visit from his grandkids. Kirk was an amazing friend, brother, son and father and he will be missed by everyone that he touched.
