






Michael Glafke McIver March 21, 1939 to Oct. 27, 2016

Mike attended school in Taft, Ore., and graduated from Taft High School as part of the class of 1957. He went on to serve our country in the U.S. Air Force. He began in basic training at Lackland AFB, Texas, in July 1957; then



onto Wichita Falls, Texas, where he attended aircraft electricians school; posted in Dauharon, Saudi Arabia, from January 1958 to February 1959 and served out the last of his military service at Fairchild AFB in Spokane from March 1959 to 1960.

In 1960 he married Charlotte LaChappelle, and they had a wonderful life together until her death in 2006. In 2008, Mike married Karen Wich, and they, too, had a wonderful life until his death. Mike and Karen were high school classmates. After 46 years of marriage for both, they were widow and widower attending their 50th class reunion. 
His mother, father and brother preceded him in death.
