The Grande Ronde Symphony will present "Magic, Mystery, and Majesty" as the theme of its fall concert, beginning at 7:30 p.m. Nov. 16 in McKenzie Theater in Loso Hall on the EOU campus. The concert will be repeated at 7 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 19 at Baker High School's auditorium in Baker City.

Zeke Fetrow will conduct as music by Beethoven, Sibelius, Mendelssohn, Schumann and Wagner explore mystery, moods and emotion.

Continuing a new tradition begun last year, a pre-concert event will be held at Ten Depot Street Restaurant at 5:30 pm before the La Grande concert. Attendees will have an opportunity to hear from Zeke Fetrow about the musical offerings of the evening's concert program while enjoying a no-host bar and light hors d'oeuvres.

Tickets to the concerts cost \$12 at the door for adults or \$8 for seniors. College students get in for \$2 and students 8th-12th grade get in for \$1. Under 8th grade get in free. Local writers, Kristy Athens, Rick Bombaci and Sara Miller will take center stage at Fishtrap's November Fireside reading set for 7 p.m. Friday at the Fishtrap House, 400 E. Grant St. in Enterprise.

"This month we have three writers who have a long history with Fishtrap" said Program Manager Mike Midlo. "Kristy Athens was a 2010 Writer in Residence, and both Rick Bombaci and Sara Miller have made great contributions to Fishtrap over the years."

Athens is the author of "Get Your Pitchfork On!: The Real Dirt on Country Living." She received an Oregon Literary Fellowship from Literary Arts in 2014 and her nonfiction and short fiction have been published in a number of maga-

zines, newspapers and literary journals. She has an M.S. in food systems and society from Marylhurst University and lives in Enterprise.

Bombaci grew up in rural Connecticut. After a brief stint living and working in Portland, he moved to Wallowa County, where he's been more or less stuck ever since. While here, Rick has worked in order, as a USFS wilderness ranger, a waiter, a bicycle mechanic, a high school teacher, a computer consultant, a grant writer, a non-profit consultant and a USFS

wilderness ranger.

Miller likes to experiment, "What I love about Fishtrap is encouragement to experiment creatively. Being invited to read at Fireside allows me to say, 'Well I better write something then.'" She is a poet and writer of creative nonfiction who appreciates opportunities to create ritual and help with hard work, especially babies and birth, death and love, ranching and wild lonely places.

After the featured readings, there will be an open mic session for audience members to share their stories as well.

Fishtrap Fireside takes place the second Friday of every month October through April at the Fishtrap House. Admission is free.

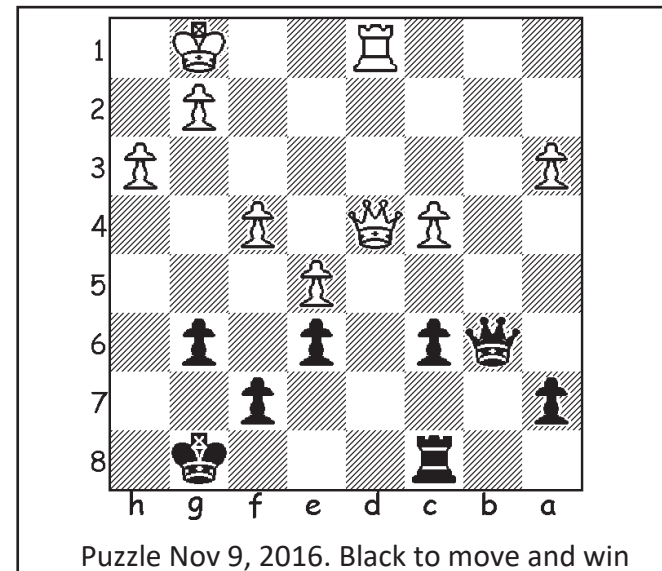
